KEY WEST, FLA. — Former Walla Walla David R. Wright, 33, died Feb. 11, 1992, at his home here.

A memorial service will be at 5:30 p.m. Friday at the Marc House in Key West. Cremation was in Key West and burial will be in the Key West City Cemetery.

Mr. Wright was born March 14, 1958, in Colorado Springs, Colo., to James and Mary Ellen DeVore Wright. As a child, he moved to Walla Walla and lived with his grandparents, Neil R. and Vera A. DeVore. He attended school in Walla Walla and graduated from Walla Walla High School in 1976.

He was employed for Stone Machinery in Walla Walla. He continued working for the company after it became Smith Truck and Tractor Co. and was later transferred to the Pasco branch.

Mr. Wright moved to Key West in 1981 and worked for Monroe Association of Retarded Citizens there. He was voted sexton of the Key West City Cemetery in 1985 and was recognized by the city of Key West for being Employee of the Year that same year. He married Carol S. MacCartee on July 27, 1991, in Key West.

He is survived by his wife, at the home; a sister, Ann Wright of Tacoma; two brothers, Eugene Wright of Tacoma and James Wright of Spokane; his parents, Mary Ellen Wright of Spokane and James Wright of Moses Lake; two grandmothers, Vera A. DeVore of Centralia and Mary Wright of Walla Walla; and numerous aunts, uncles and cousins. He was preceded in death by his grandfather, Neil R. DeVore.
